### Curriculum Vitae in summary form (January 2025)

Professor of International Law and *International Arbitration* at the Department of Law of the University of Turin since 2011, he also teaches the *online* course *International Law and New Technologies* and coordinates the *Moot Courts* Project of the same Department.

Former Chair of the Master's Degree Course in *European Legal Studies* (2018-2024), he is coordinator of the Diploma in *Law and Technology* in the same Department and Deputy Director of the Master's Degree Course in *Cultural Property Protection in Crisis Response*.

A member appointed by the Department of Law within the Interdepartmental Centre ICXT (ICT and Innovation for Society and Territory) of the University of Turin, he is also a Fellow of Despina (*Lab on Big Data Analytics* of the Department of Economics and Statistics of the University of Turin) and was the scientific head of the Department Research Project entitled 'The legal regulation of Big data between automated processing and cross-border flows'.

A contact person for the Department of Law for the *Legal Tech Day* organised in Italy in Turin in 2023 by IE University, he is currently a member of the Research Group of the same Department for the TuTeLa (*Turin Tech Lab*) project on *Legal Tech for Social Good*.

He participated in the research of the ASTRID *think tank* (founded by Franco Bassanini) on 'Artificial intelligence and law: a revolution?' and was a member of the Metaverse study group of the same institution.

A former member of the Enlarged Board of the Innovative Doctorate in *Modeling and Data Science* at the University of Turin and holder of teaching assignments in the Erasmus Mundus Doctorate in *Law and Technology*, he was for eight years an organic lecturer at the International School of Higher Education for the prevention of and the fight against *cybercrime* of the Ministry of the Interior and is the coordinator of the research funded by the Compagnia di San Paolo (Geopolitics and Technology Call for Proposals) concerning the exercise of the executive's special powers (so-called Golden power) in the field of cybersecurity.

A former Secretary of the World Political Forum under the presidency of Ambassador Luigi Guidobono Cavalchini, he is Secretary of SIOI Piedmont and Valle d'Aosta, a Full Member of the International Institute of Humanitarian Law in Sanremo and Vice-Coordinator of the Turin *Chapter* of the *Centesimus Annus Pro Pontifice* Foundation, in the context of which he carries out in-depth studies on ethical-legal issues relating to artificial intelligence.

He is a member of the Coordination Committee of the Interest Group on International Law and New Technologies of the Italian Society of International and European Union Law, a member of the *Advisory Board* of the *Journal of Law, Market and Innovation* and a member of the scientific and editorial boards of *Il Diritto del Commercio internazionale*, *Global Jurist*, *Giurisprudenza arbitrale* and *DPCE online*.

He is the author of two monographs and more than sixty publications on topics of International Law and EU Law, with particular reference to the relationship between international law, EU law, the Internet, Big Data and Artificial Intelligence.

He has been a speaker at more than eighty national and international scientific, popular and third mission conferences and workshops.

An international lawyer, he has been a member of the Turin Bar since 2001 and is Of Counsel at Studio Legale Pavesio e associati with Negri Clementi (Turin - Milan - Rome)
